The school has once again made a mark securing an astounding 100 per cent pass result.

A total of 125 students appeared for the exams in both Science and Commerce stream and 110 secured distinction. It's indeed a glorious

achievement that nearly 50 per cent of the 75 students who appeared in the Science stream have scored 90 per cent and above.

In the Commerce stream of the 50 students who took the exam, 90 per cent scored a distinction 16 of whom scored above 90 per cent.

Ranking first in the Science stream is Athira Nair who secured 96.4 per cent, followed by Nayantara Suresh scoring 96 per cent in the second position and Sadhiya Shiraj bagged the third place

with 95.2 per cent.

In the Commerce stream: Madhura Milind Patwardhan topped the first position with 95.4 per cent, followed by April Suzanna Varkey with 95.2 per cent placed second and Meera Madhusoodhanan Pillai with 95 per cent in the third place.
